The small town of Frankland River is blessed with a range of bush types that provide food and shelter for local animals. At the southern entrance to town lies Loc. 1997. This special piece of diverse bush provides a wide variety of native plants and an opportunity for birds and other animals to move across the landscape safely.

Many of the plant species found here are suitable for use in revegetation projects and for gardens and parks in the Frankland River area. Using local plants is a good way to ensure that Frankland River retains its unique character and also ensures plants are well adapted to local conditions.

Urban bushland needs to be managed to keep it healthy. This involves keeping out weeds and rubbish and protecting the bush from fire.

Generally, bushland should not be replanted as that can introduce weed species, soil pathogens and other problems. It is better to allow the natives to do what they do best by removing competition. Always start by protecting the best bush first then moving in to remove weeds from the least weedy areas. For more information on bushland management contact Green Skills on (08) 9848 1019.
